

What I Can Do to Promote International Scouting in My Troop

1. Encourage all youth and adult members of my troop to wear the World Crest as a symbol of their membership in a world brotherhood.
2. Encourage my troop to participate with a local amateur radio operator in the annual Jamboree-on-the-Air amateur radio event during the third full week of October.
3. Locate a high school or college foreign exchange student who has been a Scout in his or her country, and have the student share with my troop his or her Scouting experiences.
4. Earn the World Conservation Award and encourage others in my troop to do so.
5. Hold an international night in my troop. Learn about Baden-Powell and the history of world Scouting or about Scouting in another nation.
6. Get one or more troop members to participate in the World Jamboree.
7. Take up a troop collection for the World Friendship Fund of the Boy Scouts of America.
8. Encourage my troop to organize a patrol exchange with a troop from another country and provide an opportunity for participants to earn the BSA International Youth Exchange emblem.
9. Get a patrol from my troop to participate in a Jamboree or Camporee in another country.
